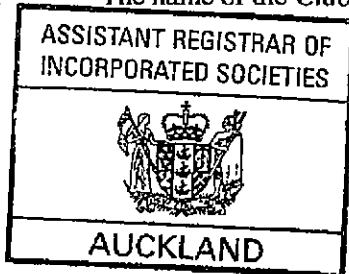

Interpretation

- 1 In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires "The Club" means The Avondale Jockey Club Incorporated
 "The Committee" means the Committee of the Club for the time being
 "The Course" means the Avondale Racecourse and any other racecourses and training grounds, and all lands over which the Club shall have control of for the time being
 "The Rules" means the Rules of the Club from time to time in force "The Rules of Racing" means the rules and regulations now in force and from time to time hereafter made by New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing Incorporated or any other such body that replaces the same
 "Year" means the year after the 31st day of July, which shall be the financial year of the Club
 Words importing the singular shall be read as including and applying to the plural as the case may be, and vice versa

Name

- 2 The name of the Club is the Avondale Jockey Club Incorporated

Objects

- 3 The objects for which the Club is established are -
- (a) To hold race meetings and promote, regulate and assist the sport of horse racing
 - (b) To do all such other things as the Club or Committee think desirable for the purpose of furthering the objects of the Club or incidental or conducive to the attainment of the objects

Membership

- 4 The members of the Club shall be -
- (a) All persons who at the date of adoption of these rules are members of the Club
 - (b) All persons who are hereafter elected members under these rules
- 5 The numbers of members of the Club shall be determined by the Committee from time to time

Election of Members

- 6
- (a) The election of new members shall be by decision of the Committee following the procedure set out in the rules hereinafter
 - (b) Each candidate for membership must sign a nomination paper on a form prescribed and approved by the Committee and shall be proposed in writing by two members of the Club by signature on a nomination form. Such nomination form must contain the full name, address and occupation of the candidate and shall be lodged at the Club's registered office
 - (c) If eligible, but subject to there being a vacancy, the candidate shall be balloted at the next or any ensuing meeting of the Committee
 - (d) Three adverse votes at the ballot shall exclude the applicant and no ballot shall be valid unless at least seven votes are recorded
 - (e) The procedure at the ballot shall be under the control of the Committee and shall be in accordance with the bylaws, if any are in force, regulating such ballots. After the result of the ballot is ascertained the Chairman at the meeting shall declare the result and that declaration shall be final
 - (f) The approved candidate after the ballot shall not be entitled to the privileges of membership until payment of the annual subscription, whereupon he/she shall be entitled, to be enrolled on the list of members
 - (g) The successful candidate shall be advised of his election in writing at the address shown on the nomination form and shall receive at the time a copy of the rules. If the candidate fails within twenty-eight (28) days after notification of election to pay the annual subscription such election shall be void

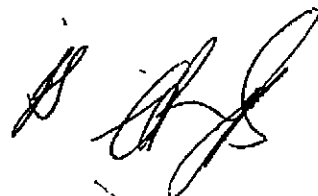


Annual Subscription

- 7 The annual subscription shall be set by the Committee and shall be payable in advance on the first day of August in each year, provided that any member who has been a member for not less than twenty-five (25) years shall only be required to pay an amount equal to one half of such annual subscription
- 8 Any member who fails or neglects to pay the annual subscription within three months after the due date may be removed by the Committee from the list of members and shall thereupon cease to be a member, but the Committee shall have the power within the current year to reinstate the name of such person on the submission in writing of an explanation for the neglect to pay being satisfactory to the Committee and by paying the amount due
- 9 No member shall be competent to vote at any meeting or enjoy any of the privileges available to a member, while his subscription is in arrears
- 10 A member shall give notice of any change of address to the Secretary who shall enter the same in the Register of Members Any letter, notice or other writing posted to a member at the address shown in such register shall be deemed to have been received by such member at the time at which the letter would be delivered in the ordinary course of the post
- 11 Any member who may have rendered exceptional service to the Club may be elected a Life Member of the Club upon the unanimous vote of the Committee present at a duly constituted meeting Such life member when elected, shall be entitled to all of the privileges of an ordinary member of the club without paying any subscription or any other fees

Eligibility for Membership

- 12 No bookmaker, nor any person carrying on or engaged in or otherwise connected with the business of a bookmaker, shall be eligible for membership of the Club
- 13 No person who is disqualified under the Rules of Racing shall be eligible for membership of the Club
- 14 No member shall by reason of membership have any transmissible or assignable interest by law or otherwise in any property of the club
- 15 No person holding a paid appointment from the Club shall be eligible for membership, and no member shall receive remuneration for services rendered to the Club as an officer or committeeman, or derive any pecuniary gain within the meaning of The Incorporated Societies Act, from the property or operations of the Club, provided however, that any member of the Club shall be entitled to receive remuneration for services rendered to the Club as Counsel, Solicitor,



Accountant, Architect, Auditor, Builder, Scrutineer, Contractor or Returning Officer, or for any other special service for which he/she may be employed by the Club

Cessation of Membership

- 16 Any member who shall be disqualified under the Rules of Racing, trotting or greyhound racing, shall upon such disqualification, cease to be a member of the Club
- 17 The Committee may erase from the list of Members any person who has been convicted by a Court of Law of a criminal offence, or in its opinion is guilty of grossly improper or dishonourable conduct or riotous behaviour or drunkenness or of conduct prejudicial to the interests of the Club, whether this shall happen at any racemeeting or otherwise

Before the Committee shall exercise the power herein given, the Secretary shall post to such member at the address shown in the Register of Members not less than seven days notice of the meeting at which his/her conduct or behaviour is to be the subject of inquiry under this rule and requiring such member to attend the meeting of the Committee with such evidence as he/she may consider necessary, and to answer the charge or complaint, and in the event of such member failing to attend or to answer the said charge or complaint the same may be heard and determined by the Committee in his/her absence

- 18 A member may resign by notice in writing to the Committee signed by the member, or lodged at the registered office of the Club, provided however such resignation shall not, unless the Committee shall otherwise determine, release him from any subscription due at the time of resignation
- 19 The name of any member who has resigned or ceases to be eligible, shall be removed from the Register of Members

Privileges of Membership

- 20 Every member shall be entitled, on production of his/her membership badge, to admission to all parts of the course or stands, excepting those enclosures or parts of the course which shall from time to time be reserved by the Committee for special purposes Members badges shall be issued in such manner and in such form as the Committee from time to time may prescribe
- 21 Every member shall be entitled to such number of guest tickets for such race meeting of the Club as may from time to time be prescribed by the Committee Such tickets shall be issued in such form, or in such manner and subject to such regulations as the Committee may prescribe
- 22 Members' vehicles shall be admitted free of charge to the course on racedays to such areas as are set aside for parking by the Committee



Honorary Members

- 23 (a) The Governor General of New Zealand and his/her staff shall be Honorary Members
(b) Honorary Members shall on the day or days for which they are admitted, have the same privileges of admission to the course and stands as ordinary members, but no other benefits or privileges whatsoever

Visitors

- 24 The Committee may admit any visitors on racedays, and accord them the privileges of Members

Officers

- 25 (a) The Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President and ten members as hereinafter elected
(b) The President and Vice-President shall be elected annually. In the event of the President for any reason being unable to continue in office, then the office shall be assumed by the Vice-President in an acting capacity until such time as a new President is elected
(c) No person shall hold the office of President for more than five years from the time of such election
- 26 The present Committee of the Club, excepting the President and Vice-President shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the Club when five members shall retire and five shall continue in office. The first five members to retire shall be the members of the Committee not elected at the annual meeting of 1998. At every subsequent annual meeting the five members who have been longest in office since the last election, shall retire provided that every member so retiring shall be eligible for re-election. If at any time doubt shall arise as to the members of the Committee who should retire as aforesaid, such doubt shall be settled by lot
- 27 A person shall cease to hold office as President or Vice-President, or as a member of the Committee
(a) Upon ceasing to be a member of the Committee
(b) Upon accepting or permitting his/her nomination or appointment to any office in any other racing club, trotting club, greyhound club, or like organisation, or
(c) If being made a member of the Committee he/she is absent without the consent of the Committee from three consecutive meetings of the Committee
Provided, however, that rule (b) shall not apply to any office bearer who may be elected or appointed to the New Zealand Racing Industry Board, the New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing Board, or the Board of the Totalisator Agency Board



- 28 Any vacancy occurring within the Committee after the annual meeting, or by reason of the President or Vice-President being unable to continue in office, may be filled by the Committee. Any member so elected to fill the vacancy shall retain the office only until the next annual meeting. All vacancies not filled under these provisions shall be filled at the first annual meeting after the vacancy occurred. If at the annual meeting the vacancy is not filled the Committee shall appoint a person to fill it.

Election of Office Bearers

- 29 (a) Nominations for the election of the President, Vice-President or Committee shall be in writing signed by not less than two members and shall be received by the Secretary at the registered office of the Club by 5pm, twenty-one (21) days before the date set for the annual meeting.
- (b) No member of the Club shall stand for election to more than one office in the one year and no office bearer who has been appointed for a term continuing beyond the Annual Meeting shall be able to stand for office unless before the day fixed for the closing of nominations the member resigns from office.
- (c) No person being a member of the Club for less than twelve months from the date of joining shall be eligible to stand for office.
- 30 (a) If the number of candidates for office exceeds the number of vacancies an election shall be conducted by ballot.
- (b) The Secretary shall, not later than fourteen (14) days before the Annual Meeting, post to each member a voting paper containing the name and address of each candidate and the names of the candidate's proposers. In the case of a candidate being a member returning from office that name shall be marked with an X.
- (c) A member wishing to vote shall delete the names of the candidates for whom he/she does not want to vote for, and shall sign inside the envelope and return the voting paper to the Secretary of the Club therein. A vote returned in an unsigned envelope or containing more than the number of vacancies shall be declared invalid. Members may vote in the aforesaid manner at any time until the closing of the ballot referred to in these rules, but ballot papers must be received by the Secretary at the registered office of the Club by 5pm on the day preceding the day set for the Annual Meeting.
- (d) The Committee shall, before the ballot is closed, appoint two persons to be scrutineers. Office bearers and candidates for office shall not be eligible for such appointment.
- (e) The Secretary shall hand the unopened envelopes to the scrutineers who shall be responsible for counting the votes. The scrutineers shall hand to the President who shall be Chairman of the Annual Meeting of the Club, a signed declaration stating the names of those who have been successful and at the Annual Meeting the President shall declare the result which shall be final. In the event of a tie between candidates the President shall have a casting vote.
- (f) If at any time after nominations for office have closed and the number of nominations does not exceed the number of vacancies, a ballot will not be necessary and the candidates will be declared elected by the President.

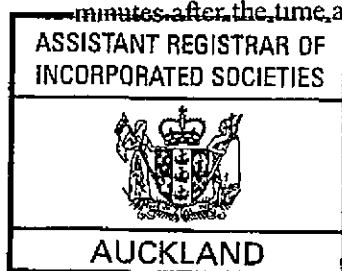


Annual and Special Meetings

- 31 The Annual General Meeting of members of the Club (in these rules generally referred to as the annual meeting) shall be held in the month of October at such hour and place as the Committee shall appoint for the purpose of -
- (a) Receiving and considering the Committee's report on its affairs, together with a duly audited balance sheet and statement of accounts for the past year
 - (b) Electing office bearers in accordance with these rules
 - (c) Considering and dealing with such other business as may come properly before the Annual Meeting
- 32 The Secretary shall post to every member a notice convening the Annual Meeting and a printed copy of the report, balance sheet and statement of accounts at least seven days before the annual meeting
- 33 The Committee may at any time call a Special General Meeting upon giving fourteen (14) days notice to every member and therein stating its objects, and shall convene such a meeting on the requisition of twenty-five (25) members signed by them and specifying the object(s) of such meeting within fourteen (14) days of receiving the requisition. At a special meeting the discussion shall be confined to the object(s) specified in the notice thereof
- 34 At least four weeks notice shall be given by the Committee to members of any special proposal question or subject considered by the Committee to be of special importance, or of any proposed new rule, or the repeal, alteration or suspension of a rule to be dealt with at any Annual or Special Meeting

Procedure at Meetings

- 35 No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time the meeting proceeds to business. At all Annual and Special Meetings ten percent (10%) of the current financial membership, provided it is not less than thirty (30) members, shall form a quorum
- 36 If after half an hour from the time appointed for an Annual or Special Meeting a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day of the next week, and at the same place. When such adjourned meeting is reconvened and the quorum is not attained, the meeting will be similarly adjourned until a quorum is reached
- 37 At any such meetings, the President of the Club shall preside, or in his absence, the Vice-President shall preside. If both the President and the Vice-President are absent fifteen (15) minutes after the time appointed for the holding of the meeting, the members present shall elect



one of their number to be Chairman. The Chairman shall in all cases of equality of voting, have a casting vote

- 38 All resolutions passed at a duly constituted meeting of the Club held in substantial conformity with these rules shall be conclusive and binding on all members
- 39 No member whose subscription is in arrears, or who is otherwise indebted to the Club, shall be entitled to sign any requisition to the Secretary or the Committee, or to vote at any meeting of the Club, or be entitled to receive from the Secretary or the Committee any notices convening a meeting or otherwise, and will be excluded from the counting of any votes on any motion or resolution, or in the number of members present at any meeting, or in the proportion necessary to carry any resolution or for any other purpose
- 40 (a) At any meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll has before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands been demanded,
(i) By the chairman, or
(ii) By at least seven members present
- A poll demanded on any business shall be taken forthwith and the result shall be entered in the minutes as conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of, or against the resolution
- (b) At all meetings, when there is equality of voting, the chairman shall have a casting vote
- (c) All decisions arrived at and carried by a majority of any special or general meeting held in conformity with these rules shall be binding and conclusive on all members of the Club, with no motion to reconsider any such decision during the year in which the decision has been made unless the Committee determines otherwise

Committee Meetings

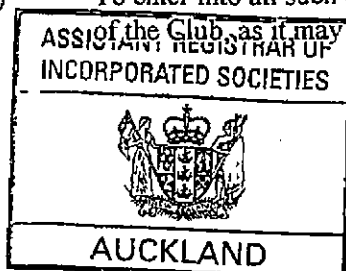
- 41 The Committee shall meet whenever necessary to transact the business of the Club. The Secretary shall, at the request in writing of the President or Vice-President or three members of the Committee, convene a meeting of the said Committee
- 42 The Secretary shall give to each member of the Committee seven days notice unless any member shall agree to dispense with such notice, or attend without such notice, or shall be absent from Auckland
- 43 The President or in the President's absence, the Vice-President, shall act as Chairman at all meetings of the Committee. In the absence of both the President and the Vice-President the members of the Committee present shall elect a Chairman for the meeting
- 44 The quorum necessary for the transaction of business by the Committee shall be five
- 45 Questions arising at meetings of the Committee shall be determined by a majority of votes and in the case of equality of votes the chairman shall have the casting vote



- 46 No member of the Committee shall sit or vote on the hearing or consideration of any matter in which that person has a pecuniary interest
- 47 The Secretary and an auditor shall hold office during the pleasure of the Committee and shall be paid such remuneration if any, as the Committee may decide from time to time

Powers and Duties of the Committee

- 48 The Committee shall conduct, control and manage all the affairs, concerns and business of the Club in all things according to their discretion and in accordance with these rules For this purpose and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, the Committee shall have the power -
- (a) To invest, dispose of and deal with the funds and property of the Club as it thinks fit for the carrying out of its objects and for the promotion and conservation of its interests
 - (b) To enter into such contracts on behalf of the Club as it may deem desirable
 - (c) To purchase or acquire lands for the use of the Club as for such other use or purpose it may from time to time decide
 - (d) To improve, manage and develop all or any part of the property of the Club and to sell, exchange, lease or otherwise dispose of such part of the Club's property as from time to time may be required, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine
 - (e) To borrow or raise money for such purposes and upon such terms, and such manner as the Committee may deem necessary in the interest of, or for the carrying out of the objects of the Club, upon the security of a mortgage or charge, floating or fixed, or debentures, or debenture stock over all or part of the Club's property and assets, both in the present and in the future
 - (f) To prepare and issue programmes for all race meetings held by the Club during the year and to prepare the conditions and advertise the running of such races as it may deem expedient to be made public during the term of office, and to make such regulations as it may deem necessary for the racecourse
 - (g) To make regulations from time to time governing the admission to and exclusion from the course of persons other than members during any raceday
 - (h) The Committee shall appoint annually a judge, starter, clerk of the course clerk of scales and such other officials as the Committee may determine are necessary to conduct race meetings The Committee shall determine the remuneration and duties of any person appointed In the absence or disability of any person so appointed, the Committee shall make any necessary arrangements to appoint other persons to perform duties as it thinks fit
 - (i) To appoint and at its discretion remove, discuss and suspend all such officers, agents and servants of the Club, whether permanent or temporary or to fix and determine their duties, salaries and other terms and conditions pertaining to their respective appointments
 - (j) To institute, conduct, defend or abandon any legal proceedings by or against the Club or its officers, or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Club
 - (k) To claim, use for or recover in the name of the Club or otherwise, all of or any of the subscriptions or other monies due from any member of the Club
 - (l) To enter into all such contracts and execute and do all such acts and deeds and things in the name of the Club, as it may consider expedient for the purposes of the Club



- (m) The Committee shall have all the powers vested in them by the Rules of Racing
(n) The Committee shall have the right to obtain and hold licences pursuant to the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 and its amendments passed in substitution therefor

Alteration of Rules

- 49 Subject to Rule 33 hereof the Club may at any Annual or Special General Meeting with the sanction of a majority of those members present either in person or by proxy alter, add to or suspend any of its Rules

Secretary

- 50 The Secretary of the Club shall be appointed by the Committee for such term, as such remuneration and upon such terms as the Committee may think fit Any such Secretary so appointed may be removed by the Committee The Committee shall determine the duties of the Secretary and may, in the absence of the Secretary, appoint any other person or persons to perform such duties

Seal

- 51 The common seal of the Club shall be kept at the registered office of the Club in such custody as the Committee shall direct, and shall be used only by the authority of the Committee Every instrument to which the seal is affixed shall be signed by two members of the Committee, or by one member of the Committee and the Secretary

Dissolution

- 52 In the event of the winding up of the Club, or its dissolution by any means whatsoever, the funds, property and assets of the Club remaining after all legal claims against the Club have been satisfied, shall be dealt with and disposed of for such public or charitable purposes as the members shall determine at a special meeting convened for the purpose Failing any determination within six months after the decision to wind up or dissolve the Club has been arrived at, then for such public or charitable purposes as shall be determined by a Minister of the Crown for the time being having control over the administration of the gaming laws then in force in New Zealand This rule shall not be altered, or suspended, or repealed except with the approval of the said Minister



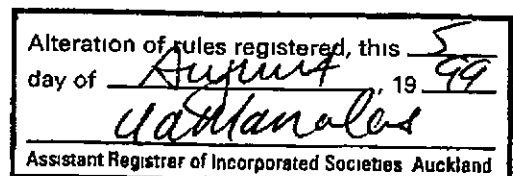
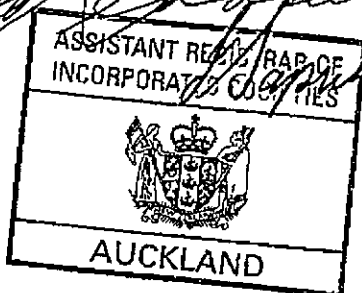
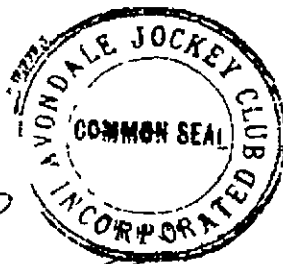
Indemnity

- 53 The Committee and each and every member thereof, shall be fully indemnified by and out of the funds of the Club, against any loss, damage, expense, or liability incurred by reason of, or in connection with, any legal proceedings instituted against them, either collectively, or individually, for any act done, committed or suffered in relation to the performance or professed performance of any of their official duties

Bylaws and General

- 54 The Committee shall have the power from time to time to make, alter, amend or repeal any bylaws for carrying out these rules and for the regulation of its own proceedings as it may deem expedient, provided however, that such bylaws shall be entered into a book to be kept for that purpose
- 55 If any case occurs which is not provided for in these rules, it shall be determined by the Committee

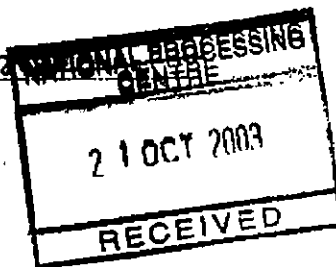

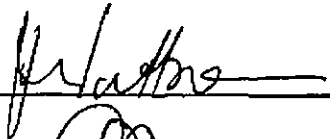
